Surgical Procedures

Dog spay/neuter <65 lbs: \$105 Pregnancy: \$35

Dog spay/neuter 65-84 lbs: \$125 Cryptorchid: \$30-75

Dog spay/neuter >85 lbs: \$145 Hernia repair: \$15+

Owned cat spay/neuter: \$75 Feral cat spay/neuter: \$55

No animal should go without pain medication, so we provide pain control on the day of surgery. We strongly encourage all owners to purchase extra pain medication to go home with their pet at a cost of \$10. We also recommend an e-collar to go home to ensure that they cannot lick their incision. You can pick one up with your pet for \$5.

Other Services



Wellness exam: \$25

Animals that come in for surgery receive an exam, and that is included in the cost of surgery. For pets who come in for a vaccine visit, there is a base charge of \$25 for the routine exam done by the doctor.

Illness exam: \$35

Animals that come to our Wellness Wednesday clinics with any symptoms of illness including, but not limited to, respiratory infections, vomiting or diarrhea, and skin or ear infections will be charged an illness exam fee. Animals with health concerns, even relatively basic ones, require a more extensive exam to ensure an appropriate treatment plan is made. The increased charge associated with the illness exam ensures we can continue to dedicate the proper amount of time to our ill patients.

Rabies Vaccination: \$10

In Franklin County, the rabies vaccination is required for all pets over 12 weeks of age. Therefore, we require all animals 12 weeks of age and older to receive a rabies vaccination the day of their surgery unless proof of current rabies vaccination is shown at drop off. Proof can either be in the form of a dated rabies certificate or a shot record from your regular veterinarian's office - a rabies tag is not sufficient proof of current rabies vaccination, as it can be put on any pet.

Other Dog Vaccinations: \$10

We recommend that both the Distemper/Parvo Combination vaccine, the Bordetella (Kennel Cough) vaccine, and the Leptospirosis vaccine be done every year. If this is their first time getting those shots, they should be boosted 3-4 weeks later.

Microchip: \$25

A microchip is about the size of a grain of rice, so the needle is even wider - for this reason, we try to only microchip pets while they're asleep for surgery. It can be done



awake if your pet is prone to escape, or if they have already been spayed/neutered. We use Home Again microchips, and the price includes registration for life.

Pre-Surgical Bloodwork: \$60

For pets over the age of 7, we do in-house bloodwork before spay/neuter surgery to confirm their liver and kidneys are working well enough to undergo anesthesia.

Bloodwork: \$75+

We offer many types of bloodwork tests through Antech and Idexx. If you are interested in a specific one, please email us to confirm we can do it.

Revolution: \$5-15 - Revolution is a topical one-month flea and tick preventative. It is \$5 for cats and \$15 for dogs.

Canine Wellness Services

Physical Examination: \$28

An annual physical is recommended to ensure optimal health, and is required, by law, for rabies vaccinations.

RVT Examination: \$18

Brief physical examination available only to patients who we have seen within the last year, and only for the following appointment types:

Vaccine boosters (first administration must be by a veterinarian)

Diagnostic Screenings (Including heartworm testing)

Please note that there are no exam fees for nail trims, anal gland expressions, or microchip implantations.

Heartworm Testing: \$25

Heartworms are spread by mosquitos, and live in the heart and lungs of unprotected cats and dogs. Prevention is simple, economical and effective, while treatment is costly, painful, lengthy, and not always successful.

Fecal Examination: \$25

Screens for intestinal parasites. Recommended annually.

Microchip Implantation with Lifetime Registration: \$25

A microchip is a permanent form of identification placed beneath the skin. We do not require an exam for this visit.



Rabies Vaccination (1-Year): \$15

Rabies is a fatal neurological disease, and its vaccination is required by law. Includes county tag.

DHPP (Distemper-Hepatitis-Parainfluenza-Parvo): \$18.50

This combo vaccine protects against distemper, a fatal disease that takes two forms; neurological and respiratory. This vaccine also protects against parainfluenza, a not-so-fatal upper respiratory infection, along with parvo, a highly contagious, highly fatal disease that causes vomiting, bloody diarrhea, and lethargy, and often strikes in puppies.

DHLPP (Distemper-Hepatitis-Leptospirosis-Parainfluenza-Parvo): \$23

All of the disease coverage of the DHPP vaccination, plus leptospirosis: This disease is carried in the urine of squirrels, raccoons, possums, deer and other wildlife, found in wooded areas, grassy fields, and also standing bodies of water. Leptospirosis causes acute kidney and liver failure and is fatal if left untreated.

Bordetella: \$18.50

Bordetella bronchiseptica, also known as Kennel Cough, is commonly found in dog social areas-- boarding kennels, grooming salons, dog parks, and veterinary hospitals. Kennel cough is not usually fatal, but can pose problems for young puppies and seniors.

Canine Influenza (H3N2 + H3N8): \$22.50 CURRENTLY UNAVAILABLE

Canine Influenza is found in similar situations as bordetella bronchiseptica-- kennels, grooming salons, dog parks, and veterinary hospitals. There are several strains of the virus, the most common being H3N2 and H2N8.
